CRITERIA AND GUIDANCE NOTES





Introduction

The State School Rugby Fund is a £200k fund that will create more opportunities for boys and girls within state schools to participate in rugby by developing accessible models of support with targeted investment, within our regions. Clubs and schools can apply in partnership for either £5,000, £7,500 or £10,000 for a project to increase opportunities for boys and girls within state schools and meet the following outcomes:

Improve the health and wellbeing of young people

Develop the physical and personal skills of young people

Increase the number of players (male and female) that participate in Scottish Rugby supported play programmes

Provide activity which improves the learning, employability and employment options for young people

Criteria For Application:

- Clubs can only apply for one funding category Women's and Girls', Development Environments or State School Rugby.
 Only one application will be considered from any one club.
- Clubs must engage with their regional team before applying
- Clubs must have, or be working towards a robust relationship with the school involved. This should be a joint application from club and school.
- Schools must have agreed to the programme before the club submit the application, with dedicated curricular and extracurricular time to deliver the programme confirmed.
- We would strongly encourage applications that promote the growth of the girls' game, or one that promotes growth of both boys' and girls' rugby.
- Clubs and schools should clearly outline a spending plan for the project
- Club and school must both comply with the reporting and monitoring system to clearly demonstrate the impact of the programme.
- Projects can be part-funded by the club or other funders
- Clubs who were successful in Phase 1 with State School Rugby funding, can apply again for Phase 2 at the current level of programme
- The fund is for new initiatives, not currently invested into by Scottish Rugby (i.e. current Scottish Rugby funded 'Schools of Rugby' or Cashback Schools of Rugby.)

The closing date for applications is 25 November 2022 at 8pm. Applications submitted after this date will not be considered.

Successful applicants will informed in January 2023. Investment will be paid in two installments (50% September 2023 and 50% February 2024) upon evidence of costs. All claims must be completed by May 2024.

Clubs and schools can apply for one of the following programmes:

Rugby Starter Programme - £5,000

This programme is to support with the creation of new state school rugby programmes. Clubs and schools will work in partnership to deliver the programme. Eligible schools are those where there is currently no current club provision within the school.

Intermediate Programme - £7,500

This programme is for schools that can deliver on the Rugby Starter programme criteria or have progressed on from this level. Young people will opt into a curricular and extra-curricular programme that will educate pupils on the following:

- Values of the game, leadership, engagement, achievement, enjoyment and respect.
- Laws of the game
- Nutrition and strength and conditioning education
- Cross-curricular workshops; numeracy, literacy and nutrition
- A playing experience against other schools
- Match and individual analysis

Eligible schools must meet the criteria outlined in the "Rugby Starter Programme" as well as the following:

Developed Programme - £10,000

This programme is for schools that can deliver on the 'Intermediate programme' criteria or have progressed on from this level. Young people will opt into a curricular and extra-curricular programme that will educate pupils in the following:

- A Youth Volunteering Award (with attainment of the associated SCQF credit points)
 - Rugby Ambassadors Award
- Rugby Development and Strength and Conditioning Award at Levels 4,5 & 6
 - Developing Player Programme
- Match and individual analysis
- A playing experience against other schools
- A coaching or leadership experience that supports the delivery of a series of participation fixtures, or a festival event for Primary 7 to S3 pupils.
- Scottish Rugby and World Rugby qualifications in:
 - RugbyRight
 - World Rugby Passport
 - Mental Wellbeing eLearning Course
 - Match Official Level 1
 - Strength and Conditioning Level 1 (optional)
 - Coaching Level 1 or equivalent (optional)

Eligible schools must meet the criteria outlined in the Rugby Starter and Intermediate Programme as well as the following:
