CRITERIA AND GUIDANCE NOTES







Introduction

The State School Rugby Fund is up to £300k fund that will create more opportunities for boys and girls within state schools to participate in rugby by developing accessible models of support with targeted investment, within our regions. Clubs and schools working in partnership can apply for either £5,000, £7,500 or £10,000 for a project to increase opportunities for boys and girls within state schools and meet the following outcomes:













Criteria For Application:

- Clubs must engage with their regional team before applying.
- Clubs must have a robust working relationship with the Secondary State School that has been aligned to the ASIDE framework by the Region's School Rugby Officer. **This should be a joint application from club and school.**
- · Schools must:
 - i. Agree to the programme before the club applies.
 - ii. Have a School Rugby Champion registered on SCRUMS.
 - iii. Dedicated curricular and/or extracurricular time to deliver the programme confirmed.
 - iv. Promote the girls' game, increasing participation and growth of both boys' and girls' rugby.
- The club and school should clearly outline an agreed budget and associated spending / resource plan.
- The club and school must work with their Region's School Rugby Officer to comply with the reporting and monitoring system, clearly demonstrating the impact of the programme across the 6 outcomes articulated above
- Scottish Rugby would encourage programmes to be part-funded by the club or other funders.
- The fund is for initiatives and programme aligned to the ASIDE framework, not currently aligned to 'Schools of Rugby' or Cashback Schools of Rugby.

The closing date for applications is Sunday 26th January 2025. Applications submitted after this date will not be considered.


Successful applicants will be informed in February 2025. On award, the successful applicant should work with their Regional Team and School Rugby Officer to setup a project launch meeting where the final programme budget will be agreed. Once completed, the first 50% of the award will be distributed no earlier than August 2025, and the remaining funding will be paid upon evidence of costs. All claims must be completed by May 2026.

Investment and Development Progression

The ASIDE framework:

Before applying, Clubs and their partner State Secondary Schools must engage with their regional team.

This is to familiarise all parties with the ASIDE framework, identifying clearly the programme level and the progression target aligned to the level of funding the applied for. These should be agreed prior to submission.



Programme descriptions:

Rugby Starter Programme - £5,000

This programme is to support with the embedding of Starter rugby programmes in State Secondary Schools. Clubs and schools will work in partnership to deliver the programme to strengthen a working relationship encouraging increased participation and establishing a School to Club transition pathway. Eligible schools are those where there is supported club provision for rugby activity appearing on the Club's POAP (Plan-on-a-Page) document.

Intermediate Programme - £7,500

This programme is for schools that have evidenced delivery on the Rugby Starter programme criteria and are seeking to enhance their delivering to enable or support progression to the Intermediate programme level. Eligible schools are those where there is supported club provision for rugby activity appearing on the Club's POAP (Plan-on-a-Page) and P2A (Plan-to-Achieve) documents.

Young people will opt into a regular / timetabled curricular and extra-curricular programme that will provide opportunities for engagement by delivering on and off-field sessions that:

- Promote and embed values of the game; leadership, engagement, achievement, enjoyment and respect.
- Increase understanding of the Laws of the game.
- Educate young people about sport nutrition and strength and conditioning.
- Provide opportunities for cross-curricular workshops; numeracy, literacy and nutrition.
- Offer regular playing experience against other schools through Regional State Schools fixtures and festivals.
- Introduce match and individual analysis that could support further curricular progression.

Developed and Excelling Programmes - £10,000

This programme is for schools that have evidenced delivery on the Intermediate programme criteria and are seeking to enhance their delivering to enable or support progression to the Developed and/or Excelling programme levels. **Eligible schools are those where there is supported club provision for rugby activity appearing on the Club's POAP (Plan-on-a-Page) and P2A (Plan-to-Achieve) documents.** Young people will opt into a regular / timetabled curricular and extra-curricular programme that will provide opportunities for engagement by delivering on and off-field sessions that:

- Align to a Youth Volunteering Award (with attainment of the associated SCQF credit points):
- i. Rugby Ambassadors Award
- Offer access to relevant and appropriate Scottish Rugby courses and qualifications:
- i. RugbyRight
- ii. Coaching Essentials qualification
- iii. ITMO (Introduction to Match Officiating) Qualification
- iv. Mental Wellbeing eLearning Course
- Regular match and individual analysis of competition fixtures.
- An AGLV (Age Grade Law Variation) aligned playing experience against other schools through Regional fixtures and Regional / National competitions.
- A coaching or leadership experience that supports the delivery of a series of participation fixtures, or a festival event for Primary 7 to S3 pupils as part of a linked T&R (Transition & Retention) plan.

Programme Delivery Guidance:

In addition to the areas of delivery described in the Programme Descriptions, Clubs and Schools considering application to the Fund should familiarise themselves with the following Programme Delivery Guidelines. These should be discussed through a conversation with the Regional Team ensuring all parties (Club and School) are familiar with the relevant programme outcomes. These should be agreed prior to submission.
